## “I Love To Destroy Christians...”

Back when Corey was working on a doctorate, he taught an intro course in philosophy. After the first day of class a student named Jordan told him:

*“I want to do my final paper--my term project--on something that just devastates Christianity. I love to destroy Christians.”*

Corey explains: “Jordan didn't know that I was a Christian at that time. He wanted to write his paper on the problem of evil. I gave him some guidance on what books to read.” Only later in the semester did Jordan — and rest of the class— discover that their instructor was a Christian with two seminary degrees. ## Two Years Later...

Two years later, Jordan took another of Corey's courses. In Jordan's first paper in the new course, he quoted C.S. Lewis and talked about Jesus.



Corey says he was so taken aback that he emailed Jordan: “What is this about? Are you afraid because you know that I'm a Christian now that I'm going to give you a bad grade? Because I'm not--as long as you give me a good argument in the paper, I won't give you a bad grade.”

Jordan replied that he was now a Christian — and that the whole process started when Corey told his students one day that he was a Christian. Jordan began doing some independent research on some of the topics discussed in class and God brought him a group of Christian friends who lived out their faith. He gave his life to Christ.

He told Corey: “Now that I am close to graduating, I want to go to seminary and learn so that I can defend my faith.”
