**Andy (Illinois):** He is using books I sent him on ministry in the university to disciple other Christian professors.

**Cindy (Indiana)**: She established a Christian faculty group this year and leads them in finding ways to make their faith known.

**Preston (Louisiana):** He involves fellow professors in sharing Christ and befriending international students as they consider a relationship with Jesus.

## The Questioning Student

After attending one of our regional Christian faculty conferences, Doug, a professor in Wisconsin, came back to his campus asking God to help him meet students who lack a relationship with Christ .

That same week a student came to his office about what was, at first, an academic question. As the conversation continued she admitted that her deepest questions were about purpose and God. They talked about what it would be like to be starting a relationship with God. That evening the student went back to her apartment and committed her life to Christ. Now Doug has connected her with other Christians for follow up in her faith.

## Returning the Favor

In our last newsletter we introduced Dorsey McIntosh (right) a new staff member with Faculty Commons. As a new Christian at the University of Oklahoma in the 1970s, Dorsey credits a Christian professor with helping his new faith grow, instead of wavering. Now he coordinates trips for profs who join students on mission trips to universities around the world for Faculty Commons.

Last month we went to Sam Houston State, where he met Dr. Todd Primm (*left*), professor of biology who also leads their Cru student ministry. Todd's work through Cru as well as his witness to students outside of class over coffee is helping the "Dorseys" --who are today's students -- know Christ.
