"I learned about a relationship with God and how to have a daily walk with Him through Campus Crusade's Athletes in Action(AIA)." Dr. Colleen Eddy, Teacher Education, North Texas

When she was a student at the University of Texas, Colleen saw her relationship with God grow and she learned how to lead a Bible study. Now uses that training to lead a faculty Bible study each week on Ephesians.

She knows God has her on campus to minister to others, and that teaching others to teach math is what God wants her to be doing. "I have learned that I can make complicated mathematical concepts understandable," she says.

"I want to help my students both with math and with life." she explains. "Some will come to me with their problems. It is humbling - I don't have all of the answers for them, but many know I am a Christian. So I pray for them, and often students ask me to pray with them about tough situations."

I have a passion to work with future teachers, and to help them teach well, to build that capacity. I was inspired as a child by great teachers, and in graduate school, by professors like Colleen!

"Many of my students have families and have felt overwhelmed, especially when all of our classes went online. Cru emphasized reaching out to others and I put that into practice. As a Christian I want my students to know that I'm here for them, and for them to know that I care."
