A communications professor at Western Washington University hosted a virtual national conference for Christian communications professors.

A Christian professor and a Cru staff member shared the gospel with a University of Wisconsin professional fraternity, and 10 of the 15 students indicated they received Christ.



At MIT, a faculty discipleship group took time to discuss the role of the Holy Spirit in enabling them to be witnesses for Christ.



Faculty at Sacramento State began "prayer walking" the campus, which has grown to faculty, students and campus ministry staff now praying together every week.

Faculty at Oklahoma State University invited two Christian professors to speak on race and ethnicity. A university Vice President who attended was so impressed he offered to cover the cost of the event, and has invited the speakers back next year.



After a class discussion on the role of character in business, ten MBA grad students at Clemson asked their Christian professor about starting a Bible study.



Working with a faculty mentor from Cal Poly Pomona, two younger faculty from San Diego State have begun to meet regularly via Zoom to discuss what it means to be a Christian professor on a public university.

"How can we build into each others lives?" Faculty at University of North Texas heard about the peer discipleship group strategy and this past year launched three faculty small groups.



A professor at the University of Georgia began a discussion group with 12 students from varying religious backgrounds, using Tim Keller's *The Reason for God*. By the end of the semester, a formally skeptical student had become a Christian.



This past year a University of Florida professor met online weekly with four colleagues in an investigative Bible study, leading one of them to Christ.
